#### **MEPs' Corner**

 MEP Andreas Schieder and former mayor of Bad Ischl, MEP Hannes Heide, hosted the Europa Frühschoppen

The "Frühschoppen" is an Austrian folk custom where people meet in the morning for a get together to exchange ideas while enjoying drinks.

The main topics were the alpine associations, which are responsible for the maintenance of hiking trails, the hospitality of huts, plus offering a wide range of leisure activities in the alpine region.

Alpine associations are largely based on voluntary work. Especially associations like "Naturfreunde" support the right to free access to nature. Everyone can join the association and get to know nature as a place to relax and rest, but also as an adventure.

Climate change was also mentioned in this context. According to MEP Heide, voluntary alpine associations play a major role in raising awareness for climate change. Hannes Heide, whose roots lie in the alpine region of the Salzkammergut, has a special appreciation for the voluntary alpine services such as the "Naturfreunde", as well as for their preservation of the natural heritage.

The third main goal is to strengthen the European Community spirit and bring the issues of sustainable mountaineering closer to the responsible players in the European Union. EUMA projects, like the mountain hut map of Europe, are making this happen on a practical level.

#### NSPA: 16-17 November - Rovaniemi Arctic Spirit 2021



### Smart Rural 21 Project: 4-5 November - 2nd Smart Rural Regional Workshop: Enabling Future Smart Villages



The workshop is organised in the framework of the EU-funded 1st Preparatory Action on Smart Rural areas in the 21st Century (shortly called Smart Rural 21) project in cooperation with Stanz im Mürztal (selected Smart Rural 21 village), with the purpose of:

- 1) Presenting the outcomes of the Smart Rural 21 project to date including lessons learnt from working with 21 selected rural communities;
- 2) Exchanging about the state-of-play of Smart Villages and how to create a supportive Smart Villages policy framework with particular focus on post-2020 CAP, Cohesion Policy and other relevant policies;
- 3) Presenting inspiring smart village cases;
- 4) Learning more about how Smart Villages can contribute to reduction of CO2 emissions including renewable energy and local energy communities.

The 2nd Smart Rural 21 Regional Workshop is planned to be face-to-face while live-streaming will be provided for those who cannot travel to the venue. It is important for us to know as soon as possible who is willing to travel in November to Stanz, so that we can reserve sufficient number of rooms and arrange other logistics.
