MEPs' Corner

 The "Land kann digital!" project in the Schwalm-Eder-West region in Hesse, Germany by MEP Engin Eroglu

I have been a member of the RUMRA and Smart Villages intergroup since 2019. It was clear to me from the beginning that not only do I want to be a "passive" member of such an intergroup, but that I also want to support the integration of projects in the field of Smart Villages with all my possibilities on site.

I myself was born and raised in the Schwalm-Eder region, and therefore know all about the strengths and weaknesses of the region, especially with regard to digitalisation in this region. It was, therefore, a matter close to my heart that one of my first projects in the field of Smart Villages should also be promoted in my home region.

For the municipalities in Germany and also Hesse, there is an acute need for digitalisation, both in the area of administrations and in the area of Smart Region. Work processes must be digitalised, digital document repositories created, booking tools set up in the digital space and solutions for data storage and processing established. Rural areas must be taken along and supported in this development.

I am therefore very happy to accompany the digitalisation project "Land kann digital!" (German for: Rural areas can be digital") together with the municipalities of the Schwalm-Eder-West region as part of the state programme "Strong Homeland Hesse". Intelligent applications and data platforms are used to provide citizens with better services and transparent information. In the next two years, smart solutions will be implemented in the following areas:

1. Administrative Digitalisation (e.g. nationwide implementation of an e-file and thus the starting signal for the paperless office).

- 2. Smart Environment (e.g. noise sensors and environmental sensors (air quality) for towns along busy motorways and federal roads)
- 3. Smart Energy (e.g. analysis and upgrading of municipal properties with smart metering/building hardware to reliably track energy consumption).
- 4. Smart Tourism (e.g. digital equipment of municipal tourism properties (municipal swimming pools, open-air swimming pools, bathing lakes, camping sites, etc.), e.g. acquisition of a uniform online booking system, digital site organisation, website renewal, digital steals to promote the overall project in each municipality)
- 5. Smart Traffic (e.g. use of floating car data & development of visualisation of the corresponding data analyses.

A focus lies especially on the topic of sustainability (Smart Environment, Smart Energy and Smart Traffic).

An open urban data platform, on which all data is brought together, forms the digital infrastructural basis of the entire project. The platform enables the realisation of the application examples described above and helps the municipalities to store, analyse, evaluate and visualise their municipal data in a DSGVO-compliant manner. The platform can be used internally for administrative purposes and externally as a source of information for citizens and is the tool on which the application examples are largely based.

What is new in this project?

The novelty lies in the Smart Region concept: The approach of dynamically visualising real-time data and demonstrating the effectiveness of such an approach in different areas, as well as linking social, economic and ecological topics, is innovative.

The project in the Schwalm-Eder-West region is intended to demonstrate how municipalities can not only maintain their ability to act in the 21st century, but also expand it in a targeted manner. In addition to the use cases described above, other applications can build on the open urban data platform in the future and use the (data) infrastructure created.

I am very happy to continue to accompany this project in the future and to keep you up to date with the progress. I also hope that this project can serve as a cornerstone for many more projects of this kind, so that more and more of our regions can become Smart Villages.

participants will be invited to showcase their contribution to the recovery efforts and discuss new ways of cooperation in view of a more sustainable future.

Being young in a mountain area: Euromontana's report is out!

Euromontana, the European Association of Mountain areas, releases a new European wide report on mountain youth, 10 years after its first survey. Carried out with the support of Euromontana members and in collaboration with Educ'Alpes and the UNITA alliance, this study aims at grasping the needs and aspirations of mountain youth. At the start of the European Year of Youth, this report brings the voice of 1134 mountain young people and helps to understand if mountain areas are still attractive for young people and why. Euromontana has also compiled 6 country factsheets, available, for France, Italy, Norway, Poland, Romania and Spain.

The article presents an overview of the results obtained from the survey. This will help give a voice to people living in rural areas, highlighting their needs and ensuring that these needs are better met in the future.

"People in rural areas feel underrepresented and overlooked", these are the words that Silvia Estivill pronounced during the interview, giving voice to more than 130 million people leaving in rural areas in Europe.

"Rural residents have fewer energy choices" "they feel they should have the same opportunities as people in the cities" continued Silvia, highlighting the results of the Rural Barometer survey 2021, a first-of-its-kind study from the FREE Initiative.

• 28 February – 3 March - MWC Barcelona Returns

The executive board members Franc Bogovič and Atidzhe Alieva-Veli will be representing the RUMRA & Smart Villages Intergroup at the MWC in Barcelona.

The MWC is the world's largest and most influential connectivity event. This international exhibition attracts decision-makers in the mobile ecosystem.

Currently, registered attendees come from 2,000 different companies, 155 countries, and 50% are Director level or above.
